


TIMES B-SCHOOL RANKING SURVEY 2025

ECO-CAMPUS & LIVING-LAB

Vishwakarma University campus is a "Living Laboratory" or "Testbed" for research and development of new technologies. Eco-campus focuses on the demonstration of projects which showcase state-of-the-art technologies and solutions addressing real-life problems. Field Visit Malavali

Community Engagement at Malavali, Maharashtra



As part of the Community Work, a field visit was organized by the National Service Scheme (NSS) and the Department of Psychology, Vishwakarma University, Pune, to Malavali village in Lashirgaon, Maharashtra. 30 students of B.A. Psychology accompanied by Prof. Aditi Jain and Prof. Kailash Bhosale. The objective of the visit was to explore the socio-economic conditions, employment patterns, mental well-being, and life satisfaction of rural women, with a specific focus on their participation in self-help groups known as Bachat Gats. Additionally, the visit aimed to foster community awareness by conducting an emotional intelligence and child safety session for school children. During the field study, we conducted in-depth interactions with five women from the village who are actively involved in various Bachat Gats. These interviews provided insights into their day-to-day lives, occupational challenges, financial habits, emotional resilience, and overall satisfaction with their lifestyle. The employment opportunities in the village ranged from farming and poultry keeping to running small-scale businesses such as incense stick production and retail shops. One of the key informants, Rekha, is the head of the Kulswamini Mahila Bachat Gat and manages two businesses while leading a union of seven self-help groups. Her experience illustrated the importance of collective savings, decision-making skills, and financial independence. Another group comprising Neerabai, Aruna, and Vandana shared how the Bachat Gat helped them transition from informal savings to structured financial planning. By saving ₹100 monthly and availing low-interest loans, they felt more secure and confident in managing household needs and emergencies. The unity among the women not only fostered economic resilience but also created a safe emotional space where they could relax, converse, and find relief from daily stress. Similarly, Nividita Kodekar, a Community Resource Person (CRP), described how her role allowed her to connect nearly 50 villages with government schemes and educate women about the benefits of structured financial engagement.



She noted a significant increase in her financial literacy, networking skills, and leadership capabilities. The visit also focused on understanding mental health aspects in the rural context. Most women expressed that being part of the Bachat Gat improved their emotional well-being, helped manage stress, and provided a platform for peer support. They reported increased self-esteem, better time management, and stronger decision-making abilities. The informal evening gatherings of the Bachat Gat served as a space for emotional expression, reducing feelings of isolation. The collective empowerment process was evident as the women encouraged one another to balance household, work, and community responsibilities effectively. An important component of the visit included a community engagement activity with children at the local Zilla Parishad primary school. An awareness session was conducted on emotional

intelligence and the difference between good touch and bad touch. This session aimed to enhance children's emotional awareness and personal safety, contributing to early life skills development in a rural setting. In conclusion, the field visit to Malavali village was a meaningful experience that



highlighted the transformative power of community-based self-help groups in rural India. The visit demonstrated how collective savings, peer learning, and supportive networks contribute to women's financial stability, emotional strength, and social empowerment. It also allowed students from the Department of Psychology to apply theoretical concepts to real-life settings, making the learning experience richer and more impactful. This initiative, under the guidance of NSS and the Department of Psychology, served both as a platform for student learning and as a catalyst for community engagement and development.




NEP 2020 : 4 Year Multidisciplinary Degree

The University is ready to meet the accreditation standards and timelines set forth by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). Below is the detailed institutional plan outlining the preparedness, strategy, and timeline for a successful accreditation process.

A dedicated NAAC Accreditation Task Force has been formed, consisting of key personnel from academic, administrative, and research departments to oversee the process. The team is responsible for preparing necessary documents and ensuring that all data points required for the accreditation process are up to date on the One Nation One Data Platform as soon as it is launched.

The University has begun compiling the Self-Study Report (SSR) by gathering evidence-based documentation aligned

with NAAC's proposed metrics (68 metrics +1 as per university type and location). Workshops are being organized to ensure that all faculty and administrative departments are aware of the binary accreditation requirements and contribute relevant data. The draft of the SSR will be completed by the middle of the second month, with all evidence and data thoroughly reviewed.

The SSR documentation will undergo expert assessment by two senior academicians with prior NAAC experience—one from within Maharashtra and one from outside the state. An internal pre-accreditation mock audit will then be conducted to review parameters such as curriculum, faculty, infrastructure, governance, and outcomes, identifying improvement areas. After final validation, the SSR will be submitted to NAAC. The University will ensure complete readiness by addressing any last-minute issues identified during the mock audit.

STUDENT COUNCIL - ENVIRONMENT AND NATURE WING TREE PLANTATION DRIVE


Theme: Awareness and responsibility towards the Ecosystem.

WORKSHOP ON CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE & POCSO ACT IN COLLABORATION WITH MUSKAAN NGO, PUNE, MH AT VISHWAKARMA UNIVERSITY, PUNE, MH.

The Faculty of Law, Vishwakarma University, in collaboration with Muskaan NGO, organized a two-day interdisciplinary workshop on Child Sexual Abuse and the POCSO Act, 2012 on 19–20 August 2024. Coordinated by Dr. Apurva Bhilare and Dr. Pritee Deotale, with student lead Gargi Paranjape, the workshop brought together law and psychology students to explore child rights, safety, and psychosocial support mechanisms.

Through interactive sessions, case discussions, and Muskaan's age-based learning modules, participants gained insights into body safety, consent, digital awareness, and trauma-sensitive approaches. The workshop culminated in an impactful outreach activity at Legacy High School, Kondhwa, where students educated over 300 children on personal safety and legal rights. The initiative fostered experiential learning, interdisciplinary collaboration, and community engagement—empowering future professionals to champion child protection and promote safer spaces for children.

“CHARTING CRIMINAL JUSTICE: A SYMPOSIUM ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NEW CRIMINAL LAW”.

The Faculty of Law, Vishwakarma University, Pune, organized a thought-provoking symposium titled “Charting Criminal Justice: A Symposium on the Implementation of the New Criminal Laws” on 23 August 2024. Coordinated by Dr. Apurva Bhilare and Dr. Pritee Deotale, with student coordinator Abhishek Jagdale, the event was held in collaboration with the Police Communication, IT, and Transportation Department, Government of Maharashtra.

The symposium featured three expert-led panels discussing the landmark transition from the Indian Penal Code, 1860, to the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, the procedural shifts under the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, and evidentiary

reforms in the Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, 2023.

The deliberations emphasized how these new laws modernize India's criminal justice system by enhancing procedural efficiency, ensuring victim-centric justice, and reinforcing transparency—marking a historic step toward accessible and accountable governance.

“EDUCATE MINDS, ERASE CRIME: LITERACY FOR A SAFER TOMORROW” – A STREET PLAY ON WOMEN'S SAFETY.

Following the tragic R.G. Kar Medical College rape case, which sparked nationwide outrage, the Legal Aid Clinic of Vishwakarma University organized a street play to raise awareness about women's safety on 9th September 2024. The event was coordinated by Dr. Apurva Bhilare and Dr. Pritee Deotale, along with student coordinators Gargi Paranjape, Arfa Sayyad. The initiative aimed to educate the community on preventive measures and available support systems. Alongside the performance, a self-defence session was conducted to empower women with practical safety skills. 



on “Data Protection and Digital Safety for Women,” highlighting legal reform and digital inclusivity, and Dr. Rajeshwari Deshpande on “Women in Governance,” exploring challenges, representation, and the politics of presence in public life.

Department of Psychology Report on Extension Activity:

MIND MATTERS – EXTENDING MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

The Department of Psychology at Vishwakarma University conducted a month-long extension activity titled “Mind Matters: Extending Mental Health Awareness Beyond the Classroom” from February 6 to February 27, 2025, at the Department of Pharmacy. Coordinated by Prof. Kajree Korde and Prof. Madhuri Marathe, the initiative engaged Semester IV undergraduate Pharmacy students and allied disciplines, aiming to enhance mental health literacy, emotional resilience, and interdisciplinary collaboration.

The sessions encouraged students to explore self-awareness, manage stress effectively, practice mindfulness, and develop empathy and interpersonal sensitivity.

By blending theory with practice, “Mind Matters” provided participants with practical coping tools and emotional regulation strategies applicable in daily life. Students reported improved self-reflection, a deeper understanding of emotional health, and increased openness toward mental health discourse. The program also fostered collaboration between Psychology and Pharmacy students, emphasizing how mental well-being is integral across disciplines.


MASTER CLASS WORKSHOP ON 3D ANIMATION

differently abled students on essential personal hygiene practices.

Prof. Prajakta Kapadnis led the oral health session, demonstrating proper brushing techniques and discussing diet's role in dental care. Two female Pharmacy students volunteered actively, aiding interaction and participation. Dental kits were distributed to all 35 participants.

The program effectively enhanced health awareness, encouraged self-care habits, and provided valuable community service experience for student volunteers.

REGIONAL AYURVEDA RESEARCH INSTITUTE (CCRAS) NEHRU GARDEN (MINISTRY OF AYUSH, GOVT. OF INDIA), KOTHRUD, PUNE

The School of Pharmacy, Vishwakarma University, organized a field visit to the Regional Ayurveda Institute for Fundamental Research (RAIFR), Kothrud, Pune, on August 29, 2024, for Second Year B. Pharm (III Semester) students. The visit aimed to enhance understanding of medicinal plants, herbarium preparation, and the traditional Ayurvedic system while bridging the gap between theoretical and practical learning.

RAIFR, formerly known as the National Research Institute

in Basic Ayurvedic Sciences, functions under the Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences (CCRAS), Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India. Established in 1961, it is a premier research center focusing on the survey, collection, and cultivation of medicinal plants and houses advanced facilities including Pharmacognosy, Tissue Culture, and Molecular Biology Laboratories, a Quality Control Unit, Herbarium, and Reference Museum.

During the visit, Dr. Varun guided students through the medicinal plant garden, explaining plant identification, therapeutic uses, and conservation methods. Students also learned herbarium preparation and the relevance of Ayurveda in modern healthcare research. A total of 35 students participated under the guidance of Dr. Neeta Rai. The visit provided valuable experiential learning and deepened appreciation of Ayurveda's scientific and therapeutic significance.



INDUSTRIAL VISIT ACG CAPSULES SHIRWAL PLANT

The School of Pharmacy, Vishwakarma University, organized an industrial visit to ACG Capsules, Shirwal, on 3rd September 2024 to provide students with practical exposure to pharmaceutical manufacturing processes and advanced technologies. The visit aimed to bridge the gap between theoretical learning and real-world industrial applications, helping students understand the operational aspects of capsule production, quality assurance, and safety standards. A total of 31 students participated in the visit, coordinated by Dr. Dipali Talele and Mr. Abhijeet Pawar from the Placement Team, along with Prof. Sonali Manwatkar and Mr. Remi Thomas from the Industry Connect Cell. The visit provided a valuable learning experience, enriching students' understanding of the pharmaceutical industry and enhancing their readiness for future professional roles in manufacturing and quality management.



NULIFE PHARMACEUTICALS, PCMC MIDC AREA, PUNE

The School of Pharmacy, Vishwakarma University, organized an industrial visit to NuLife Pharmaceuticals, PCMC, Pune, on 9th November 2024 for Third Year B. Pharm (Fifth Semester) students to provide practical exposure to pharmaceutical manufacturing and Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP). Established in 1973, NuLife Pharmaceuticals is a WHO-GMP certified company recognized for its high-quality pharmaceutical formulations and over four decades of experience in the healthcare sector. The company manufactures a wide range of products including tablets, capsules, liquids, ointments, and Ayurvedic formulations, and has strong operations both in India and abroad. During the visit, Mr. Prashant guided the students through various departments, explaining industrial processes such as tablet compression, coating, packaging, and operation of the Fluidized Bed Dryer (FBD). On 19th and 20th August 2024, the Department of Psychology and the Department of Law, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Vishwakarma University, Pune, jointly organized a 12-hour capacity building workshop on “Child Sexual Abuse: Prevention and Support.” The event was conducted under the banner of the VU Pro Bono Club, in collaboration with FFCP–Muskaan, Pune. 
4) VIKSIT BHARAT@2047 SHOW

REPORT ON BOOK COLLOQUIUM – VIGYAN SE VEDANT



